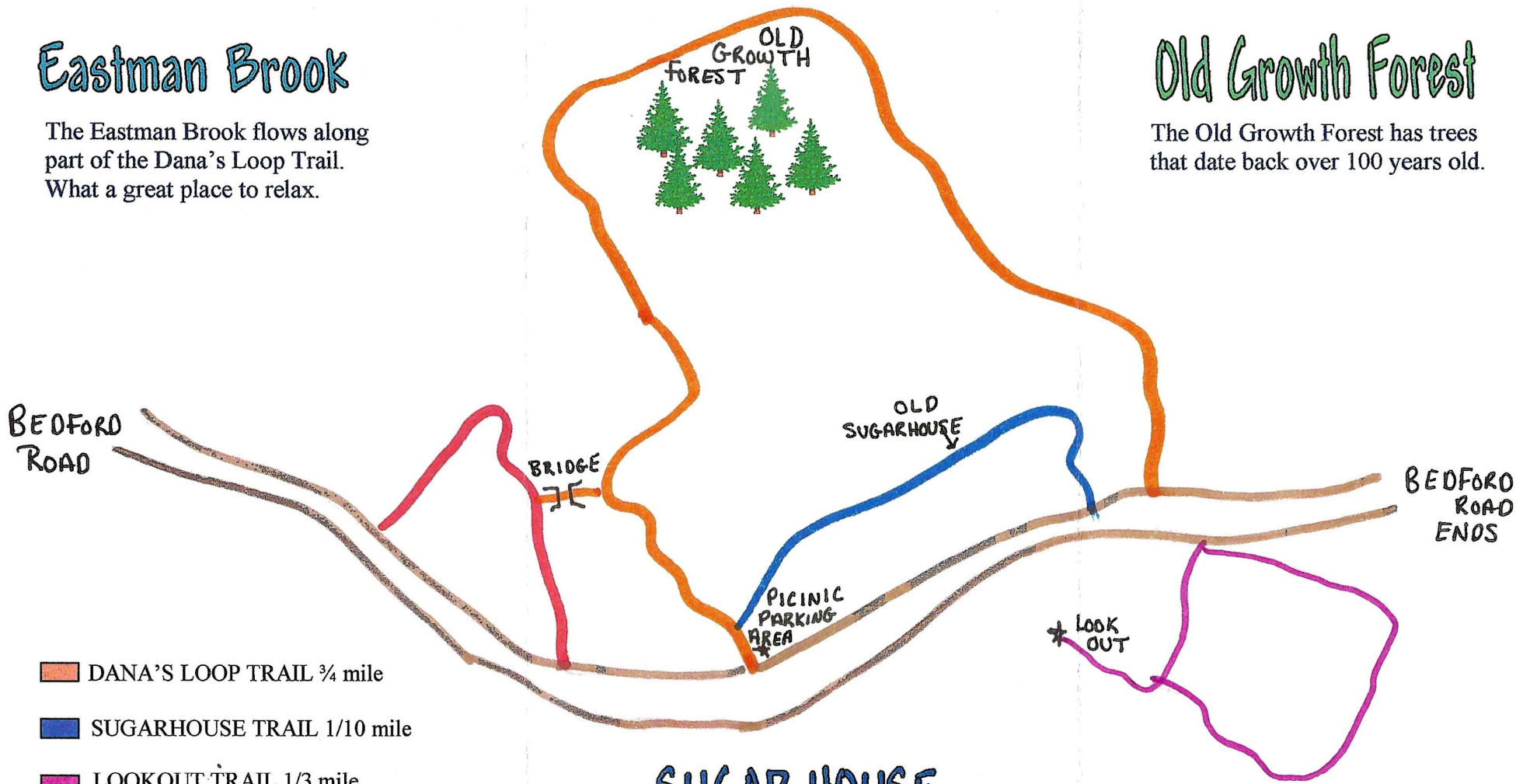






Eastman Brook

The trails are marked with different colored ribbon. If you match the ribbon color with the trail you want, then you can't get lost. If you don't then.....



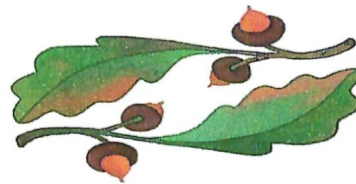
In 1997 the Piermont Conservation Commission developed this site for recreational, educational purposes and to promote wildlife and forest stewardship. Since then the Commission has performed some selective cutting and has created a trail system on the property.

The Conservation Commission and the Piermont Village School have worked together on a couple of different projects for this site, one is planting trees, the other is making tree identification signs. 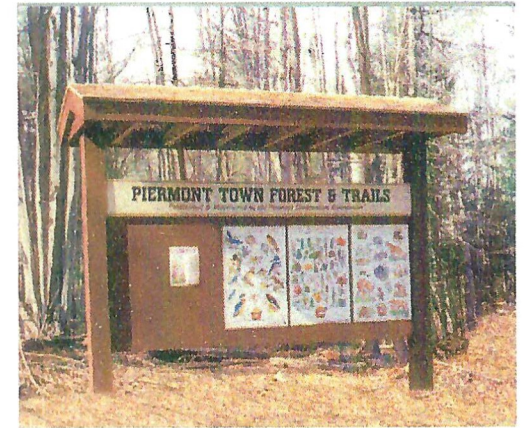
HISTORY

The property was part of a 60-acre farm with several owners throughout the years. There once stood a house and a large barn that probably included sheep, or dairy cows. The house was built in the 1830's and is now the Piermont Public Library and Town Offices. There was also a sugarhouse on the property. The sugarhouse was also built in the 1800's or early 1900's. There are many stonewalls on this property that were once used possibly for fencing, but are now used for boundaries or remembrance of days long ago.
